WERE YOU A VICTIM OF A VIOLENT CRIME? YOU MAY

QUALIFY FOR

The Louisiana Crime Victims Reparations (CVR) Fund may be able to assist with your financial burdens.

CVR is a statewide fund available to victims of crime and loved ones of homicide survivors who have spent money or incurred unexpected expenses as a result of a crime.

CVR can help pay for:

- Emergency expenses
- Funeral expenses
- Relocation expenses
- Medical bills & prescriptions
- Forensic Medical Exams after sexual assault & domestic violence*
- Dental care
- Mental health treatment & counseling
- Loss of income due to missed work
- Child care or dependent care and more
- Loss of support
- Crime scene clean-up
- Crime scene evidence

*Louisiana law states that hospitals should direct bill CVR so that survivors of sexual assault do not incur the costs for a forensic exam. This does not include domestic violence forensic exams. Domestic violence survivors usually are billed for a forensic exam with the understanding that they should apply to CVR for that expense to be reimbursed.

CRIMES THAT QUALIFY FOR CVR INCLUDE:



*CVR generally does not cover theft or property damage
